5. On this day we go to Tashlich
6. On this day we read the Megillah Esther
7. On this day we eat nuts and fruits
8. On this day we eat outside under the stars.
9. On this day we celebrate an event that happened in 1948.
10. On this day we celebrate the rededication of the Temple
11. On this day we keep the 4th commandment
12. On this day we dance with the Torah!
